## PRESIDENT IAP-ID (2018) MESSAGE



Modern medicine was born when medicine embraced modern science and its methods. It was Rudolf Virchow's cell theory of disease enunciated in the 1858 classic 'Cellular Pathology as Based upon Physiological and Pathological Histology' that laid firm basis to the testability of medical theory possible. Along with Virchow, a new breed of scientist physicians emerged who tried to explain the origin and development of disease (pathogenesis) in terms of cell biology. They were also the first Pathologists. They marched ahead in the company of physiologists and biochemists, applying pioneering discoveries in cell biology to the study of human disease.

## **NEW OFFICE BEARERS**

#### DR. SIDDHARTHA DATTA GUPTA (MBBS, DCP, MD (Path), FAMS, FICPath, FIMSA)



Dr. Siddhartha Datta Gupta is currently a Professor, Department of Pathology, and one of the three Deans of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi.

Prof. S. Datta Gupta did his MBBS and DCP from the Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore and MD (Pathology) from the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi. He was a British Council Study Fellow at the Royal Free Hospital, London in 1993 where he underwent training in Liver Pathology including Liver Transplantation Pathology.

He served as an Assistant Professor of Pathology, St. Johns Medical College, Bangalore before joining the Faculty of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi in 1988.

He was also the Professor-in-charge of the Dr. K. L. Wig Centre for Medical Education & Technology (CMET) at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi. He was deputed to serve as a visiting faculty to the B. P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences, Dharan, Nepal and he completed a two-year sabbatical as the Professor and Head of Pathology at AIMST University, Malaysia.

Prof. S. Datta Gupta is a histopathologist and his field of interest is Liver and Gastrointestinal Pathology. He has worked on both experimental and clinical aspects of liver diseases and gastrointestinal diseases. He has been teaching pathology to undergraduates for over thirty-five years and postgraduates for over thirty years now. He has supervised /co-supervised over a hundred postgraduate and PhD thesis and served as a member of PhD Doctoral Committees. He is both an undergraduate and postgraduate examiner.

He has published over three hundred abstracts and papers and contributed to chapters in several books. He has participated and delivered numerous lectures in several CMEs, Seminars, Symposia and moderated the prestigious Dr. Gaya Prasad Symposium of the India Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists. Several of the Papers and Posters co-authored by him have received awards, including the Dr. K. C. Basu Mallick Award of the Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists twice, the U. C. Chakraborty Award of the Indian Association of Pedatric Surgeons twice and the Dr. H. D. Tandon Best Poster award of the Delhi Chapter of Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists twice. He has delivered the 8th M. V. Parthasarathy - A. V. Ramaprasad Silver Headed Cane Oration of the Karnataka Chapter, the Professor B. D. Baruah Oration of the North East Chapter, the Prof. Thangavelu Memorial Oration of the Kerala Chapter and the Dr. B. K. Aikat Oration of the Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists.

He has served the Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists as an Honorary Secretary from 2005-2007, Vice President for two terms from 2014-2015 and the President in 2016. He was also one of the Councilors of the International Academy of Pathology-Indian Division. He has been associated with the editorial boards of the Indian Journal of Gastroenterology, Indian Journal of Pathology and Microbiology of which he is an Associate Editor, Indian Journal of Laboratory Physicians, Indian Journal of Dermatopathology and Diagnostic Dermatology, Indian Journal of Chest Diseases and Hepatitis B Annual and is a peer reviewer of several journals.

He has been a member of various national, institutional and academic committees including notably, the Sub-Committee of the International Association for the Study of Liver (IASL) for the Nomenclature of Acute and Subacute Liver Failure and the International Working Party on Celiac Disease of the World Gastroenterology Organization and the Asia Pacific Association of Gastroenterology and is also associated with the Indian Council of Medical Research Task Force on Celiac Disease that has developed Guidelines for the Diagnosis and Management of Celiac Disease in India.

#### **DR. USHA KINI** (MD, DCP, DNB, FICP, FAMS)



Dr. Usha Kini is currently Professor of Pathology at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore. She had her medical education at Bangalore Medical College from where she graduated and subsequently obtained DCP and MD (Pathology) from St. John's Medical College, Bangalore; and DNB from National Board of examinations, New Delhi. She continued thereafter as faculty at St. John's to Head the Department of Pathology from 2006-2010.

Dr. Usha has several awards and honors to her credit. She is a Fellow of National Academy of Medical Sciences (2011); Fellow of Indian College of Pathologists (2006); Sir C. V. Raman Young Scientist Award (Medical Sciences, Ministry of Science and Technology 2005); Dr. R. M. Khasliwal Award by NAMS (2009) or her pioneer work on Hirschsprung Disease; BMJ South Asia Healthcare Award finalist in the Category of Non Communicable Diseases Initiative (2016); Excellence in Teaching' award (2004); Dr. M. R.

Parthasarthy and Dr. A. V. Ramaprasad Silver Plaque (2015) and a national merit scholarship holder all through her studies.

Dr. Usha has delivered the Md. Yusuf Memorial Oration at the 13<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of Indian Association of Paediatric Surgeons, 2014; the Tamil Nadu-Puducherry Chapter oration at the 64<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists, Cochin, 2015; the Andhra Pradesh Chapter Oration award at the 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Conference of AP chapter of Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists, Hyderabad, 2014, Key Note address at the 2<sup>nd</sup> International Paediatric Pathology Conference, PGI, Chandigarh and presidential oration at the 3<sup>rd</sup> AIPNA-TMC International Paediatric Pathology meet at Kolkata, Jan 2019 and more than 120 guest lecturers.

She is the founder and in-charge of the Translational Diagnostic and Research Lab for Gut motility disorders at St. John's Medical College with the research initiated in 1998. She has many publications in peer reviewed journals (136) and 11 chapters in text books. She has organized 25 Workshops/CME/Conferences and conducts annual hands on workshop on the Diagnosis of Hirschsprung's disease (seven conducted so far). She has several research projects particularly in the field of gut motility disorders funded by ICMR, VGST, RGUHS, MERT etc. She is also the Principal Supervisor for the Wellcome-DBT India Alliance Clinical Research Training Fellowship, 2015. To complete her passion for pathology, Dr. Usha is a proud teacher of more than 3000 undergraduates and post graduates.

## **IAP-ID MID-YEAR TEACHING PROGRAMME 2018**

The IAP-ID Mid-Year Teaching session for 2018 was hosted by The Department of Pathology & Lab Medicine, Medanta - The Medicity, Gurugram, on 21 April 2018. The topic covered was "Direct Immunofluorescence in Kidney and Skin:Technique, Interpretation and Reporting".

The day's proceedings started with a short Inauguration program and lamp lighting. After the Welcome Address, the Inaugural Address was delivered by The Secretary and Treasurer of IAP-ID. This was followed by the release of the Conference Souvenir, by all the guest speakers, the Secretary and Treasurer IAPID and faculty of Dept of Pathology & Cytopathology, Medanta. There were 85 delegates and they had come from as far as Chennai and Nepal.

This focussed conference on DIF included a video cum demonstration of the entire procedure of DIF. The video covering the procedure followed a specimen right from the time the requisition was received, confirmation of tissue adequacy by frozen section, placing the order for the various antibodies and the actual DIF technique, with subsequent viewing of the slides. Talks covering - setting up of an IF lab, the technique, procedure and the interpretation of DIF in kidney and skin, were followed by case discussions including the demonstration of IF in all the cases. The faculty also discussed problems and pitfalls encountered during the reporting of DIF. Experienced Faculty Members and experts in their field were present to share their experience, both for cases of kidney and skin.

The discussions during the day long proceedings were engaging and kept all the 85 delegates interested till the end. The demonstration of the IF slides on a state of the art IF microscope with the attached computer system and software, specially placed for the conference, became the focus of the delegates' attention.

A unique feature of this conference was the direct involvement of the Senior Technicians and Technologists performing this procedure in the lab in the interaction with the delegates.

At the end of this conference it is hoped that the delegates would be able to start IF in their own institutions thus enhancing patient care.

### **IAP-ID ANNUAL CME 2018**

The IAP-ID XXI Annual CME was held on 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2018 at Sir H. N. The CME on "Intra-operative Consultation - Do's and Don'ts" was well attended by 132 delegates from across the country. The eminent guest faculty of renowned pathologists, oncosurgeons, oncologists and radiologists included Dr. Anil D'cruz, Dr. Vijay Haribhakti, Dr. S. V. Kane, Dr. Sunil Pasricha, Dr. Kirti Chadha, Dr. R. B.Deshpande, Dr. Asha Shenoy, Dr. Meher Ursekar, Dr. Anita Mahadevan, Dr. D. P. ## **IAP-ID ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2018**

The annual conference of IAP-ID was organized along with the annual IAPM Conference [APCON] on 29th November 2018 at Rohilkhand Medical College & Hospital, Bareilly. The conference was organised by the Dept of Pathology, Rohilkhand Medical College & Hospital, Bareilly in collaboration with IAPM (UP Chapter), Association of Bareilly Pathologists, Bareilly and Rohilkhand Academy of Pathology, Bareilly. The organising Chairman was Dr. Parbodh Kumar and the organising Secretary was Dr. Ranjan Agrawal.

There were 247 registered delegates. The meeting was organised in the Mini Auditorium of Rohilkhand Medical College & Hospital, a part of Bareilly International University, Bareilly. The conference was inaugurated by the chief guest, Dr. Lata Agrawal, Vice Chancellor, Bareilly International University. Dr. Francisco Couto, Vice President IAP, was the guest of honour. Dr. K. P. Aravindan, President IAP-ID; Dr. Francisco Couto, Vice President IAP; Dr. Anita S. Bhaduri, Secretary and Treasurer IAP-ID; Dr. Parbodh Kumar, Organising Chairperson; Dr. Ranjan Agrawal, Organising Secretary; Dr Nitesh Mohan, Joint Organising Secretary, and other dignitaries were in attendance for the lamp lighting and inaugural ceremony. This was followed by the scientific sessions.

The first scientific session was the invited guest lecture delivered by Dr. Amitabh Srivastava, M. D., Harvard Medical School & Brigham and Women's hospital, Boston, USA, on "Gastric cancer classification: The WHO and who?" The lecture was well attended with even Clinicians in the audience. The lecture covered various morphological subtypes recognized by the classification as per the World Health Organization. He also dealt with the various classification systems used for stomach cancer mentioning their merits and limitations. Recent Molecular subtypes were also highlighted. On behalf of the IAP-ID, a specially designed plaque and certificate of appreciation was presented to Dr. Srivastava by Dr. Aravindan and Dr. Bhaduri. Dr. Amitabh Srivastava also conducted a wonderful slide seminar on "Interesting cases of GI tract" which was much appreciated by the audience. The IAP-ID expresses its gratitude and is thankful to Dr. Amitabh Srivastava for having come and delivered the guest lecture and slide seminar.

A slide seminar on "Uncommon lesions of the Biliary tract" moderated beautifully by Dr. Ashim Das with Dr. Rachana Chaturvedi as the co-moderator was also held. There were 4 panellists including Dr. N. Jayaram, Dr. Puja Sakhuja, Dr. Chandralekha Tampi and Dr. Paromita Roy along with the two moderators in this session. This was followed by the symposium on "Evaluation of Post – chemo response in Cancers" with Dr (Col.) Anurag Mehta as the moderator. The panelists included Dr. Sunil Pasricha, Dr. Shruti K. Grover, Dr. Vivek Mahawar and Dr. Seema Sachan as well as Dr Anurag Mehta. This symposium dealt with recognising the changes seen with Pre-operative Chemotherapy or Neoadjuvant therapy in locally advanced cancers and some early cancers, both radiologically and pathologically for remission status. It was emphasized that post-chemotherapy changes provide important prognostic information. Also, standard grossingtechniques as well as uniform system of reporting was the main theme of discussion. The scientific programme was brought out in the form of proceedings and distributed to the delegates.

The session concluded with the Executive Committee and General body meeting of IAP-ID. The General body meeting was held in the mini auditorium and was chaired by Dr K. P. Aravindan, President of IAP-ID, who called the meeting to order. The Secretary & Treasurer, Dr. Anita S. Bhaduri, read out the minutes of the last GBM held at Bhopal on Dec 7th 2017, the annual report of the Secretary & Treasurer for 2017-2018, and audited accounts for the year 2017-2018 which were duly approved. Elections were held for the posts of President and councillor as Dr. K. P. Aravindan had completed his tenure of as President and Dr. Nuzhat Hussain as Councillor. Dr Siddhartha Datta Gupta (New Delhi) was elected as the new President and Dr. Usha Kini (Bengaluru) was elected as the new Councillor. The President Dr K.P Aravindan along with the other members congratulated the new President Dr. Siddharth Datta Gupta and the new councillor Dr Usha Kini on their election. On behalf of the members, Dr Francisco Couto thanked the outgoing office bearers for their services to the IAP-ID and congratulated the newly elected President and Councillor. It was decided that the IAP-ID Annual meeting 2019 would be held at PGIMER, Chandigarh with Dr Bishan Radotra as Organizing Chairman and Dr Ashim Das as Organizing Secretary on 5th December 2019. In addition to the invited guest lecture and slide seminar by a foreign guest speaker, it was agreed upon that the Slide seminar would be on "Pediatric soft tissue tumors" to be moderated by Dr Uttara Chatterjee (Kolkata) with a caveat that Dr. Nuzhat Hussain to help in scanning and putting up the case images on the website of IAP-ID. It was decided that the Symposium would be on "Pathology in the era of Immunomodulators" with special reference to Car-T cells and PDL1 etc to be moderated by Dr. Anita Borges (Mumbai). The Mid year teaching programme 2019 was jointly allotted to Dr Kirti Chadha, Vice President, Metropolis Labs, Mumbai and Dr Paromita Roy, Pathologist, Tata Medical Center, Kolkata, to be held at Mumbai. The theme selected was "Latest Ennovation and Advancements in Digital Pathology [LEAD] with Computational Pathology". The IAP-ID 22nd Annual CME was allotted to Dr Mala Bannerjee(Kolkata) on "Update in Inflammatory Bowel Disease".

It was advised to please update their details with the Secretary & Treasurer. The General Body approved only membership numbers, names and city of residence of members who were current and not in dues should be put up on the website. Dr. Bhaduri also informed the house that formats had been designed for submitting proposals for various programs and for symposia and slide seminar and were available for everyone to use on the IAP-ID website. This would ensure uniformity in the process of submission of topics for slide seminars / symposia and teaching programmes.

On behalf of the IAP-ID Dr. K. P. Aravindan (President IAP-ID) and Dr. Anita S. Bhaduri (Secretary & Treasurer IAP-ID) thanked Dr. Amitabh Srivastava, Dr. Ashim Das, Dr. Rachana Chaturvedi, Dr. (Col) Anurag Mehta and all their panellists for their efforts and contribution in making the conference a huge success. Dr. Bhaduri also thanked Dr. Ranjan Agarwal & Dr. Nitesh Mohan and team for hosting the successful conference and the meeting was declared closed by the President, Dr. K.P. Aravindan.
